

Assessing & Managing Risk in Primary Design & Technology

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This course is for primary school Design and Technology coordinators, subject leaders, or teachers with responsibility for Health and Safety in D&T (or aspiring to any of these roles).

You will learn how to identify, assess and reduce risk in D&T activities.

This course will be presented in a school venue.

The course shows how schools can work within the law and the British Standards Institution Code of Practice. It explains simple and effective ways to carry out and record risk assessments, using the CLEAPSS Model Risk Assessments as a starting point. These can be easily adapted to the individual needs of your school.

Central to the day is identifying the activities in practical work that could create hazardous situations and working out how to manage the risks effectively.

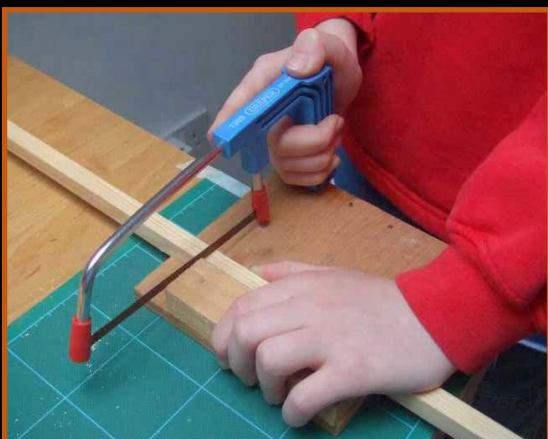
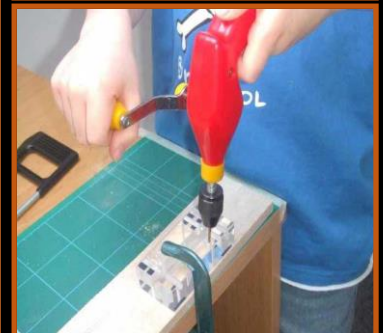
This involves:

- Using and applying health and safety guides
- Checking the school's facilities, equipment and materials
- Working, safely
- Recording any outcomes from a risk assessment process in a manageable way

The course will address all the areas of Primary D&T including working with wood and other resistant materials as well as with textiles and food. The specific practical activities will depend on the facilities available at the venue.

The outcome will be increased confidence in the use of the CLEAPSS approach to risk assessment to support the development of safe practice in practical work.

Participants who attend the course will receive a CLEAPSS Certificate of Attendance.
